- Project: **148th Ave, SR 520 (02.03.23)**
 Superintendent: **Chris Wahl**
Proper planning is essential w/tight access and overhead power lines. Be willing to change the plan as conditions change and as needed.
- Project: **35 Stone (02.08.23, 02.15.23)**
 Superintendent: **Josh Bentley**
Never tilt load forward while load elevated- make sure it's balanced with good clearance. Honk horn when raising load. Lower forks to ground when stepping out & don't use them as man lift. Always wear seatbelt & inspect equipment prior to operating.
- Project: **1916 Boren (02.03., 10, 17, 24.23)**
 Superintendent: **Ryan Pruitt, John Hicks**
Always use spotter around cranes/power lines. Work as a team. Look up to track overhead loads. Unknown personnel onsite, refer questions to superintendent.

Safety Article of the Month

OSHA Top 10 List: Construction Safety Violations/Issues for 2022:

- Fall Protection** – poorly constructed handrails, lack of warning lines and documentation of inspection.
- Hazard Communication** - missing container labeling, outdated SDS, how to use SDS information
- Scaffolding** - holes in platforms, improper access, verification structurally sound system
- Respiratory Protection** - no medical evaluation, fit test, poor respirator training, chemical hazard assessment
- Lock Out-Tag Out (LOTO)** - no energy control program, training, appropriate LO device, procedure inspection
- Ladders** - ladder side rails do not extend 3' beyond upper landing surface, poorly secured base, not 4:1 (V:H)
- Powered Industrial Trucks (forklift)** - no refresher training, lack of daily inspection, unauthorized attachments
- Fall Protection (Training)** - recognizing fall hazards in the work area, certification of training, infrequent inspection - documentation
- Machine Guarding** - lack of guarding on metal cutting devices, conveyors; sufficient anchoring of machinery
- Eye and Face Protection** - wearing non-ANSI (Z87.1) approved safety glasses; not wearing face shields around flying debris
